Every child and family who joins our setting will have their own knowledge and experiences that will link to their culture and wider family. This might include: languages, beliefs, traditions, cultural and family heritage, interests, travel and work.

Our curriculum at Ludlow Primary School is underpinned by four drivers: Confident Communicators, Growth Mindset, Citizens of the world, and Healthy Body/Healthy Mind. They are derived from an exploration of the backgrounds of our students and our beliefs about high quality education and our values. They are used to ensure we give our students broad and ambitious curriculum opportunities.
