<u>Weekly Maths - Measuring Capacity (break it up over the week)</u>

- 1. Find empty containers put water in them—explore the words full, empty, nearly full and nearly empty.
- 2. Compare how much water a container can hold using the words more and less.
- 3. Fill 4 identical containers with different amounts and order from most full to least.
- 4. Investigate—how many cups/yoghurts pots (anything small) does it take to fill different size containers? Order these containers from largest capacity to smallest capacity.
- 5. Make potions e.g. 1 cup of water, 2 cups of grass, a cup of mud. (if you have food-colouring you can have different colours of water and add them).

Senses experiments (cGet the whole family involved and complete as many as you can)

- Smell/Taste Can you identify the different foods by their smell and taste?
- Touch Blindfold yourself. Feel and object, can you guess what it is?
- See get a tray and place several items on it. Cover with a tea towel. Remove the tea towel for 30 seconds and allow children to look at the items. Place the tea toel back over the tray. Can the children remember what items were on the tray.
- Hear stand close to each other. Adult makes a noise. Keep taking steps back until your child can no longer hear you. How far away did them get? What happens if you make the noise quieter/louder?
