YEAR 2: 2 Oak and 2 Ash - Week 4 of Home Learning tasks ACTIVITY EXPLANATIONS and DETAILS Week commencing 27/4/20

The following pages contain detailed information about what to do in each task. There are a lot of pages but we are hoping that they contain all the answers to any questions you might have. If not, please get in touch.

Daily Written Task (in home learning book)

Day 1: Read and learn some actions to the first paragraph of Pandora's box. You could also create your own story map to help prompt you. Remember you don't need to draw a picture for every bit – just the main parts to help you remember it.

Day 2: Continue to read and learn some actions to the **second paragraph** of Pandora's box. Continue with your story map.

Day 3: Read and learn some actions to the **third paragraph** of Pandora's box. Continue with your story map.

Day 4: Read and learn the **fourth paragraph** of Pandora's box using actions to prompt. Continue with your story map.

Day 5: Draw a picture of what you think Pandora's box looked like. Can you label it with some adjectives to help describe the box and then write your paragraph describing the box?

Daily phonics (online)

Using the Phonics Play website <u>www.phonicsplay.co.uk</u> (use the log-in details: User Name: **march20** Password: **home)**.

Go to the Children's area. You will need to make sure that you choose the Phase that matches the colour story book that you are reading.

There are lots of different games – choose a different one each day from your Phase.

Daily spelling task (spelling log books)

- Continue to learn to spell the Year 1 and 2 common exception words, as list of those words are in your diaries or in your home learning pack.
- Learn the spelling pattern: Plurals (more than one) words ending in y. Changing the **y** to **ies.** lad**ies**, aunt**ies**, penn**ies**, hobb**ies**, enem**ies**, famil**ies**, countr**ies**, discover**ies**.

Daily Reading Task (record this in your reading diary)

Read each day, either a book from home or an ebook on Oxford Owl. https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/

If you would like to listen to a book, there are free children's books from Audible. This is a lovely way to access books that children might find a little tricky to read themselves. https://stories.audible.com/start-listen

Reading comprehension activity

Using the "How to be a Lion" by Ed Vere resource (this is a PDF document uploaded in our folder on the website), listen to the story then answer the questions in your blue books. Have a go at reading it yourself - can you make it sound as interesting as the author, Mr Vere?

Daily Maths Tasks (recorded in home learning book)

This week we are continuing to focus on fractions. Make sure your child is confident with halves and quarters from last week before moving onto this.

How to access the on-line lessons:

Go onto this website: https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/

Click on year 2 and week 2 - There are five lessons - one for each day. If you child is finding the year 2 work too tricky, try them with the year 1 work first.

Every lesson comes with a short video teaching the unit, showing clearly and simply how the children can complete the activity successfully. Make sure you watch this video first.

Each lesson also includes their version of fluent in five as a daily starter and again there is a video supporting this. You should pause it, have a go at the questions in your blue book, then it goes over the answers in the video for you to mark. There is no need to print off the sheets. The answers can be written directly in blue books.

The videos will help the parents in supporting the children in their learning plus the answers are there too. We would suggest writing the answers in your blue book while you are looking at the worksheets on the screen. There is a separate file with the answers that you can look at after to mark your work.

Daily Times tables maths task:

Times tables and division facts: (2s,5s,10s,3's). If you follow this link https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/5-7-years/times-tables, you will find a lot of different games to play (in addition to Hit the Button) to help with times tables.

If you can't access the internet, practise writing your tables in your blue book. Try the division facts $4 \div 2 = 2$) and also write them in any order. too (so $2 \times 2 = 4$

Daily Number bonds task:

On the School website in our Year 2 folder, there are a range of worksheets for number bonds to 10, 20 or 100 as PDF files. Aim to answer 10 questions a day as quickly as you can.

There is a <u>Daily 10</u>. If you choose Level 1, Addition, there are opportunities to practise number bonds – you need to write down you answers. You can choose how much time you have to answer and the answers are revealed at the end.

Handwriting:

Continue to practise your letter formation, size of letters and capital letters.

There is a <u>PDF document</u> of the cursive letter formation for you to look at on-screen while you practise in your books. Your capital letters should reach the top of the line and lower case letters are half the size of capital letters. Sit them all on the line.

There is also a <u>non-cursive</u> <u>sheet from RWI</u> for those who are not yet joining but focusing on formation. <u>There's a guide</u> <u>for parents</u> on how the formation is taught too.

Computing:

Watch this video about what an algorithm is.

You can use the 2Go activity on Purple Mash which is in your 2dos.

You could even pretend to be a human beebot. See if your child can give you an algorithm to get to a certain place? Can you give write give them an algorithm? Can they predict where they will get to?

Remember it is very important that the algorithm you give is clear!

Grammar Hammer:

This is an activity that we complete at school that the children may enjoy doing at home. This is now a chance for your child to have a go at this on their own. See if they can beat their score from last week.

Art

Create your own time capsule. You can use the activity sheets on the document attached or you can make your own.

Comprehension:

On the school website there is a comprehension activity about sunflowers. There are different level activities. The worksheet with three stars on *** is the highest level.

Ask your child to read the text, you can support them with this if needed. Then they can have a go at answering the questions. It will be good practise for the children to record their own answers. However, this can also be done verbally.

History: William Shakespeare

Watch a video about the life of William Shakespeare. It was his birthday on 22nd April (it is thought). Design a birthday card for him and practise writing like Shakespeare.


Oak Academy Teaching: DAILY LESSONS
