Weekly Written Task (in home learning book)

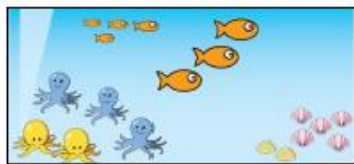
Spring is here! Spring is here!
