Speed Sounds Set 2 - for children in Reception that can read Set 1 Speed Sounds and for children in Year 1 and 2

- Set 2 Speed Sounds and Word Time 10.00 am
- Set 2 Spelling 10.15am

Don't worry if you miss a lesson. Once each set has been shown, they will replay one a day from each set.

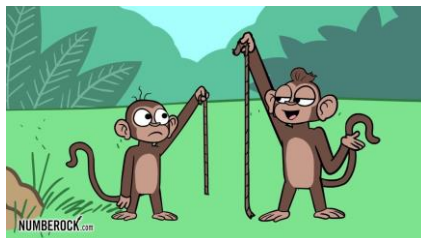

Home Learning Challenges



Can you make a rain gauge to find out how much rain has fallen in your garden or outside space? Put a plastic container or the bottom half of a plastic bottle outside. How much rain have you collected after a few days? How could you measure the amount of rain you've collected?

Make a weather chart and record the weather for a week. Write the days of the week on the chart and each day draw a picture to show the weather for that day. How many different types of weather did you have?

The next time it rains, go out puddle jumping with a grown-up. Put on your wellies and jump in the puddles. What words would you use to describe the puddles? What sounds can you hear when you jump in them?

Do you know all of the colours in a rainbow? - red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. Go on a rainbow hunt in your home or on a walk. See if you can find something for each colour of the rainbow. When you have finished, try to draw your own rainbow using all the colours.

On a sunny day, we sometimes hang our washing on the line for the sun to dry. If you had 4 T-shirts hanging on the washing line and 4 skirts, how many things would there be altogether? Draw the washing to find the answer.

Pour a little pile of flour onto a table. Imagine that the flour is snow. What would you like to do in the snow? Spread the snow out on the table with your hands. Can you make patterns in the snow? Can you write your name?
