First person is a way of story-telling through the narrator's point of view using first-person pronouns such as 'I' and 'we'.

Personification

Personification is when you give an animal or object qualities or abilities that only a human can have.

This creative literary tool adds interest and fun to poems or stories.

Personification is what writers use to bring non-human things to life.

The poetry we look at over the next couple of days is going to be based around the weather.

Let's think about the wind and the rain. What do these different types of weather make you feel or think about?

Today, we are going to think about how we can personify the sun and the snow.

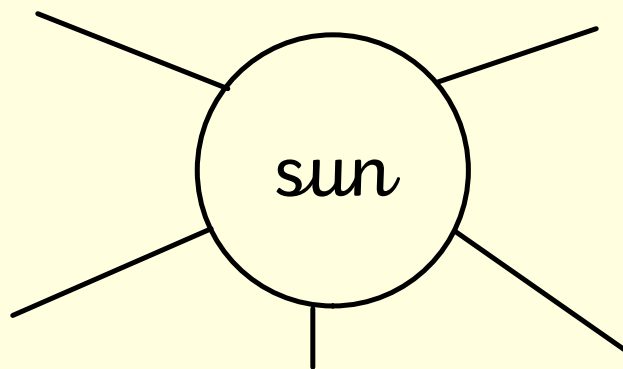
This means that we're going to imagine that each of them is a person with real thoughts and feelings.
