

Read Write Inc Phonics – At Home Lessons



Read Write Inc phonics is the scheme we use to teach phonics in school, and I know that teachers have been directing you to their YouTube channel in their weekly home school planning.

How to choose the right video:

Reception

Choose set one, read red words 1 and read and hold a sentence 1 videos

Year 1 and 2

Ask your child which phonics group they were in.

Mrs Chidley - set 1 and set 2

Ms Bolton - set 1 and 2

Mrs Lucas - set 2 and set 3

Mrs Lloyd-Kitchen - Set 2 and set 3

Mrs Minton/Miss Houchin - Set 2 and set 3

Miss Rathbone - Set 3

Mrs Grant - Set 3

Mrs Lacey – choose the read longer word videos (see below)

As well as the set 1, 2 and 3 sound videos there are also the following videos to watch. Choosing the right video depends on the colour group your child was in for phonics (these match the storybook colours mentioned below) . I have colour coded the groups above so that you know which videos to choose.

New daily films:

- Read longer words: for children who can read Set 3 sounds and words confidently.
- Read Red Words 1: for children who are reading Red, Green, Purple, Pink and Orange Read Write Inc. Storybooks. Many children are able to read these in Reception.
- Read Red Words 2: for children who are reading Yellow, Blue and Grey Read Write Inc. Storybooks. Many children are able to read these in Y1.
- Read and Hold a Sentence 1 (from 15th June): reading and writing practice for children reading Green, Purple, Pink and Orange Read Write Inc. Storybooks. (For children reading and writing with Set 1 sounds confidently and learning Set 2 sounds.)
- Read and Hold a Sentence 2 (from 15th June): reading and writing practice for children reading Yellow, Blue and Grey Read Write Inc. Storybooks. (For children reading and writing words with Set 2 sounds confidently and learning Set 3 sounds.)
