

How to choose the right video:

Mrs Minton/Miss Houchin - Set 2 and set 3

Mrs Grant - Set 3

Mrs Lacey – choose the read longer word videos (see below)

New daily films:


- Read longer words: for children who can read Set 3 sounds and words confidently.
- Read Red Words 1: for children who are reading Red, Green, Purple, Pink and Orange Read Write Inc. Storybooks. Many children are able to read these in Reception.
- Read Red Words 2: for children who are reading Yellow, Blue and Grey Read Write Inc. Storybooks. Many children are able to read these in Y1.
- Read and Hold a Sentence 1 (from 15th June): reading and writing practice for children reading Green, Purple, Pink and Orange Read Write Inc. Storybooks. (For children reading and writing with Set 1 sounds confidently and learning Set 2 sounds.)
- Read and Hold a Sentence 2 (from 15th June): reading and writing practice for children reading Yellow, Blue and Grey Read Write Inc. Storybooks. (For children reading and writing words with Set 2 sounds confidently and learning Set 3 sounds.)

Doubling numbers

White rose home learning has a video about doubling numbers. Go to w/c 15th June, Lesson 2. We will put a variety of worksheets on the website for those who wish to print.

Spend lots of time looking at doubling numbers.

e.g. double 2 is 4

Use counters/lego/pasta etc to show doubles. Get two cubes. Now get two more. How many do you have? Double 2 is 4.

Pick a card out of a pack of playing cards can you find the double of that number.

Use dominoes to show doubles

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Draw dots to show double - I draw 2 dots you draw two dots. Double 2 is 4.

<u>Sharing</u>

Begin to look at sharing groups of objects. Get two plates and share out the biscuits. If I share 4 biscuits between 2 people then we get 2 each.

Share out toys, coins (any objects).


Discus sharing equally.

If I have 6 biscuits and I share them between 2 people we get 3 each. We have shred equally. If I share them between 4 people then we can't share them equally because 2 people would get 2 biscuits and 2 people would get 1 biscuit.

Draw pictures of plates and ask chn to share an amount buy drawing dots.

e.g.

Share 8 between 2



8 shared between 2 is 4 each
