**Speed Sounds Set 2** - for children in Reception that can read Set 1 Speed Sounds and for children in Year 1 and 2

- Set 2 Speed Sounds and Word Time 10.00 am
- Set 2 Spelling 10.15am

Hold a sentence 1 and Read red words 1 - for children in Reception.

• Available daily from 9:30am

Don't worry if you miss a lesson. Once each set has been shown, they will replay one a day from each set.

# Maths Home Learning Adding More

I count, you count is a game which can be used to practise counting on from different starting points. Begin by counting as you point to yourself. When you point to the children they continue the count. This is great for creating rhythmic patterns:

1, 2,	3, 4,		5,6	¢.	7, 8
1, 2, 3	3, 4	5,	6	7,	8, 9
3, 4,	5, 6		7, 8,	9,	10,

Show me 5 fingers. Now show me 2 more. How many fingers now? How do you know there are 7? Did you count them all 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7? Is there another way to count them? We know we have 5 on this hand? Can we count on? 6, 7?

> Use first, then now to tell simple maths stories to practise adding more in real life contexts.
