Read the words and exaggerate the last sound.</p> <p>magical plural vocal tropical medical comical capital animal crystal signal festival sandal</p> <p>How many syllables do the words above have? Is it one, two or three?</p> <p>Words of the week: <i>Therefore, incident, accidental</i></p> <p>Can you find out what they mean – try writing them into a sentence. Challenge: Can you drop the words into a conversation with your family?</p>
