



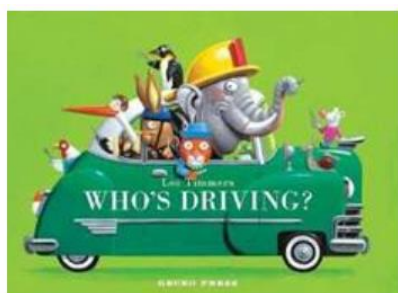
# New children's books we love

This fun-filled board book, full of stylish illustrations and detail, contains an array of animals and vehicles which will delight young children.

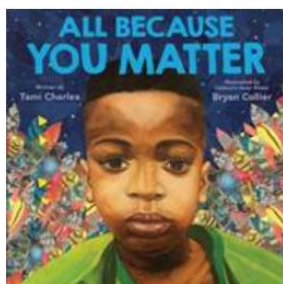


#### Supertato: Super Squad

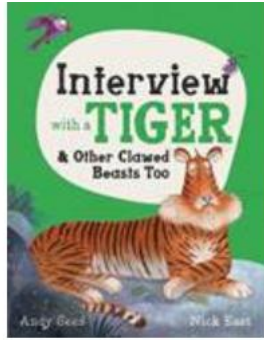


#### Fergal Meets Fern
