


New children's books we love <u>July</u>



Author: Benjamin Zephaniah Illustrator: Nila Aye




Rosa Park's story is brought to life for a young audience in this wonderfully accessible picture book, with comic-style illustrations.


Will Jakeman's Marvellous Mechanimals
