Key Talk for Writing Text: The Gingerbread Man

Please see below for our half-termly overview :

 Literacy Phonics (RWI) - Read all Set 1 sounds; blend sounds into words orally. Reading - Children start on wordless books and then progress in line with their phonics knowledge. Daily 15-minute class story time and discussion. Sharing books selected by children to take home 3 times a week to develop a love for reading. Writing - The Gingerbread man (Fiction) and Wanted posters (Non-Fiction). Write own name. Hear, say and write some sounds in words based on their phonic knowledge. Write initial sounds in words.
